WINTER COAT GIVE AWAY WITH BURLINGTON COAT FACTORY

Hope For You, Delivering Good Inc., and Burlington Coat Factory, during the 13th Burlington Coat Drive that held from November 2019 to January 2020, gave out winter coats to the needy in over 80 cities and communities across 21 states.

RESPONSE TO HURRICANE IOTA AND HURRICANE ETA

Hurricane Iota and Eta were devastating Category 4 hurricanes that wreaked havoc across parts of Central America in early November 2020. It affected our churches and parishioners in Nicaragua, Honduras, etc. The total contributions we received toward the assistance for Hurricane Iota and Eta was \$4,127.50.

HFY assisted and gave two checks totaling \$15,000.00 (\$7,500 for each cause) to the country coordinators in charge of the regions in Central America, Pastor Bayo Fadugba and Pastor Segun Oluwayemi. This will help to address some of the basic emergency assistance needed.



ADVOCACY EFFORTS



ADVOCACY

HFY was involved more in advocacy in year 2020 through a partnership with other like-minded nonprofits to advance important social issues we care about, to ensure that underserved communities have a voice in the policies that impact their lives, and to get more information and resources that RCCG churches can use as they consider how to faithfully respond over the coming days and weeks ahead. Some of the organizations are Bread for the World (DC) for advocacy efforts on Global Nutrition etc., Pan African Women (PAW/PAWEEN) and Pan African Young Adult Network (PAYAN). Micah Global, Humanitarian disaster Institute, Christian Churches Together, Black Lives Matters etc.

BLACK LIVES MATTER

With collective effort and united approach, America can be better than what it is now! As a faith-based institution, HFY partners with other civil and community leaders for meaningful conversation and dialogues that bring healing and proffer lasting solution towards a better economic and judicial system in this country.

EMPOWERMENT TRAINING

HFY organized series of trainings. One of the trainings, 'Engaging Your Parishioners in Advocacy' was attended by about 65 pastors from Dallas / Fort Worth. Faith In Texas was invited for the presentation. Faith in Texas engages people, communities, and voters through community organizing, civic engagement, and leadership development to create pathways of opportunity for all Texans to thrive. The pastors discovered how to engage their congregation in advocacy in a biblical and lawful way.

COLLABORATION WITH NORTH TEXAS GIVING DAY

HFY, in its effort to seek alternative avenues to generate more income for regular operations, joined the community of Non-Profit Organizations in a program called North Texas Giving Day. This is an avenue to source for financial assistance programs from individuals and corporations who would choose to partner with HFY. The event which culminated in September 2020 yielded a total of \$432.87. HFY is hopeful that this will help in the long run.



Hope WEBINARS For You

HFY and RCCGNAO organized series of webinars including You Got Questions, what else can you be doing for your church and community right now? Etc. The speakers focused on: Addressing members' concerns and questions about COVID-19, Resources available both at the local and national level, What it's going to take to address the current hunger crisis and what role the Church will play through advocacy, and how our churches can be a voice in time like this.

Experienced international guest speakers included:

- Commissioner Christine, Canada, serves at United Nations on the UN Multi-Faith Advisory Council and she is also the president and Chair for Micah Global.
- Rev. Dr. Angelique Walker-Smith is the National Senior Associate for Pan African and Orthodox Church Engagement at Bread for the World based in Washington D.C.
- She is also President of the Historic Black Church Family of Christian Churches Together (CCT) also made up of many of the USA national churches.
- Froswa Booker-Drew, Ph.D. is the Vice President of Community Affairs for the State Fair of Texas responsible for grantmaking, educational programming, and community initiatives.
- Some of the Medical personnel that were invited are Dr. Femi Taiwo, Emergency Medicine Physician and Dr. Seyi Ojo, a certified Breast Surgeon.

EFFORTS AT THE LOCAL LEVEL



Hope INVOLVEMENT WITH GREENVILLE CITY *For You*

HFY had a unique open door in the year 2020 to boost its relationship with local agencies. Some of the agencies included United Way, FISH community assistance program, Senior Citizen Center, etc. HFY director, Dr. Funmi Adeyemi was invited by HCHS to join Hunt County LEPC (Local Emergency Planning Committee). HCLEPC oversees emergency and disaster response for Hunt County. Through the partnership, RCCGNAO H/Q was selected to participate in, and also host the county's disaster drill /preparation. This was originally scheduled for April 8, 2020, but was canceled because of COVID-19. This is the first time RCCGNAO would have this opportunity. This will help us to establish and refine our crisis management plans and operations in case of any disaster like tornados, etc.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

From January to December 2020, Hope For You financially assisted people with their various needs. COVID-19 crisis increased the need for financial assistance. There has been a rise in the number of people that lost their jobs, those who became homeless and those with financial hardship for daily living. Hope For You assisted these individuals and families as funds became available.

WAREHOUSE PROJECT - HFY DISTRIBUTION CENTER

In the second half of year 2020, Hope For You expanded its operations with the construction of a new warehouse. The contractor, DFW Construction and Development LLC, built a 10,000 square ft. warehouse for HFY's operations. The warehouse was also joined to the existing building that HFY was using before (this was also remodeled). In total, HFY now has about 14,000 sq ft. capacity warehouse. This has aided our capacity to respond to the needs of more than 20 cities in and surrounding Dallas / Fort Worth metroplex.

COVID RELIEF EFFORTS

RCCGNAO REGION 6 was given \$2,000.00 from the disaster relief project account to respond to the COVID-19 disastrous impact in New York.

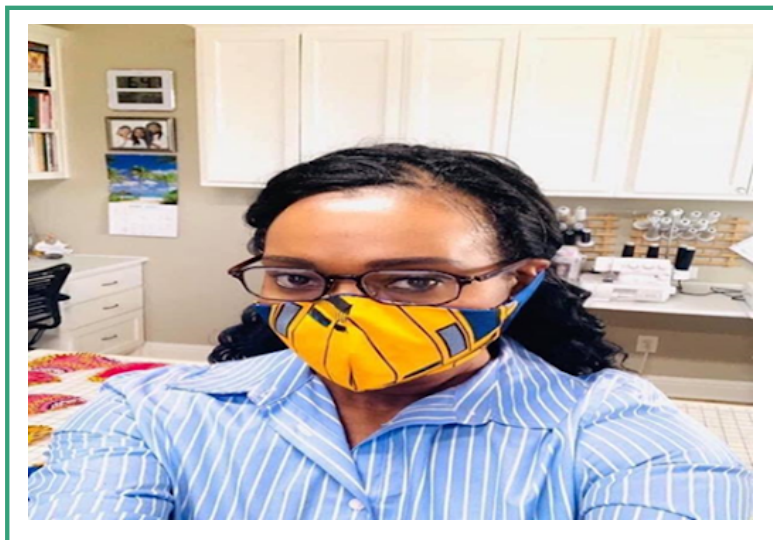
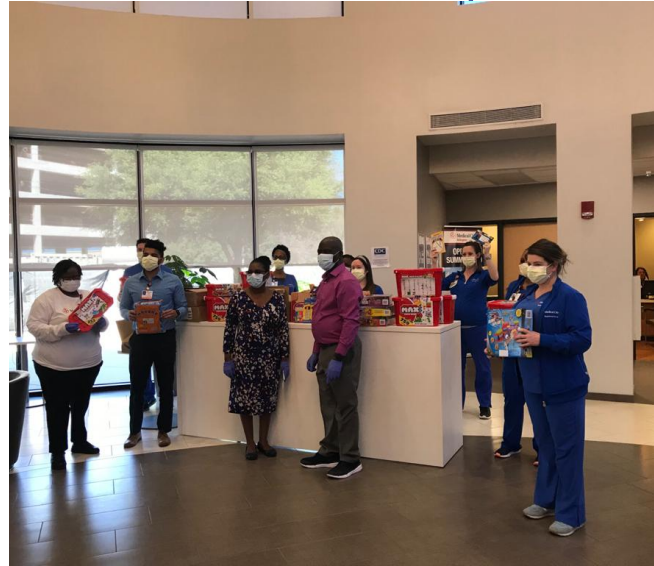
HEALTH CARE DONATIONS

- HFY also provided monetary assistance and gifts in kind to the health care workers, hospitals, patients, and staff. Donated items include PPE, recreational items, latex-free gloves, surgical face masks, surgical gowns, disposable aprons, patient socks, kleenguard protective wear, surgical shoe covers, surgical caps.
- Social activity items like pens, markers, crayons, notebooks, glue sticks, highlighters, children's activity books, children's Sunday school curriculum, hygiene wipes etc. were given to places such as: McDonald Children Home and Various Schools.

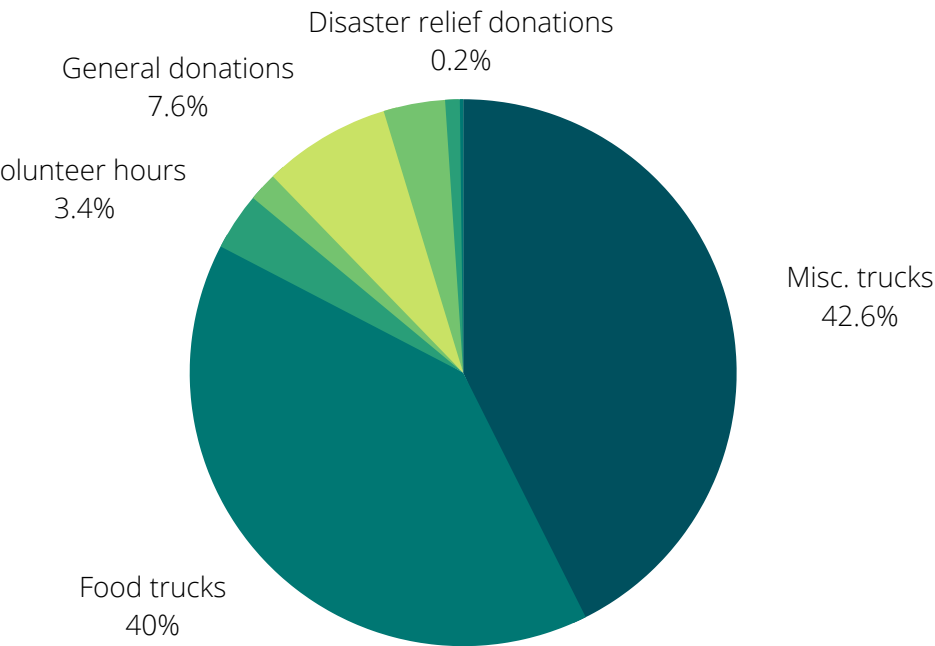
FARM TO FAMILY DISTRIBUTION

HFY served several communities with fresh produce, milk, and meat. The produce comes in 17 lb. boxes and each box has apples, oranges, carrots, onions, potatoes, cheese, chicken, beef sausages and pinto beans and each box cost about \$44.75 at wholesale price. HFY received truckloads of this produce with each truckload containing about 15 pallets of produce and 69 boxes of milk with 4 in each box. Each produce pallet has 84 boxes. The total value of each truckload as stated in the Bill of Lading is \$56,385.00. Each RCCG partner church receives these boxes in pallet quantities to serve their communities and Six truckloads were also given out in Greenville and Lewisville TX.

HFY Still Feeds!

Fresh produce and food pantry programs are still blessing thousands of lives. The number of churches that are doing the programs has significantly increased. Over 13,920 individuals and 3,360 families were served through more than 100 RCCG churches that partner with their local food banks. 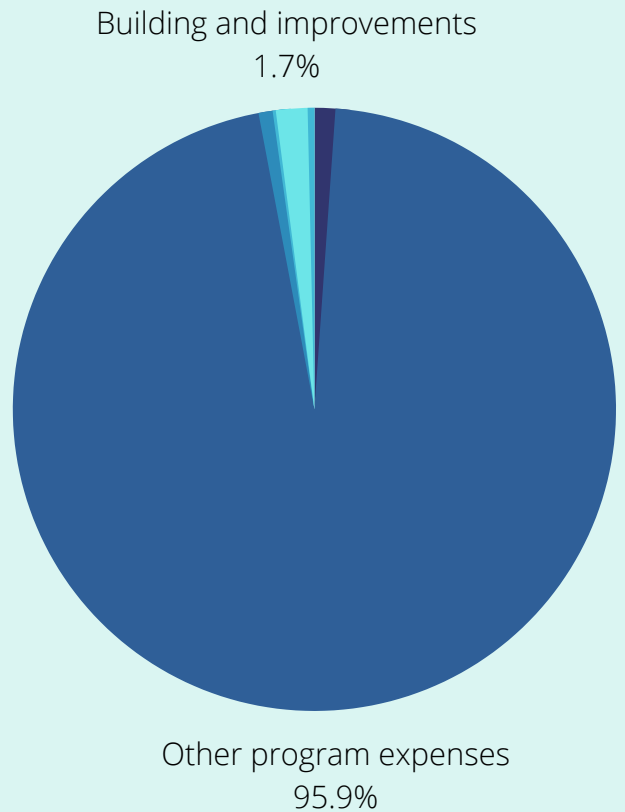

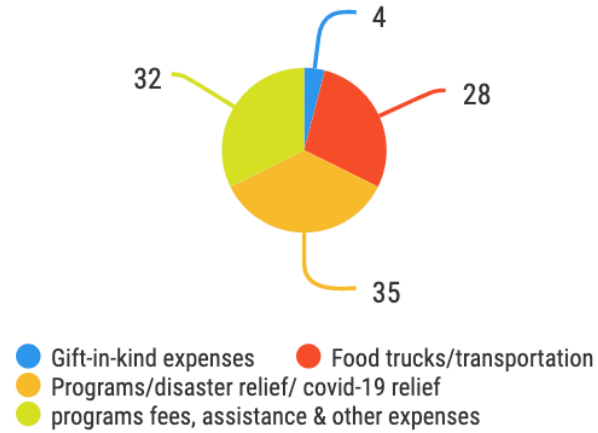

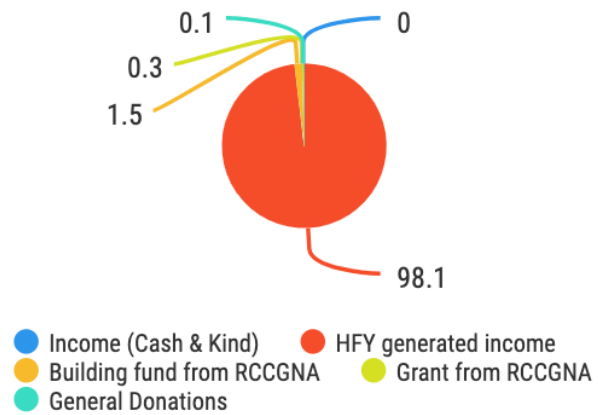

Expenses (Cash Only)



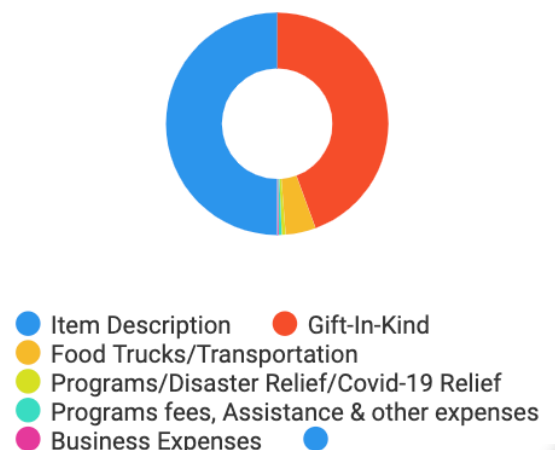
