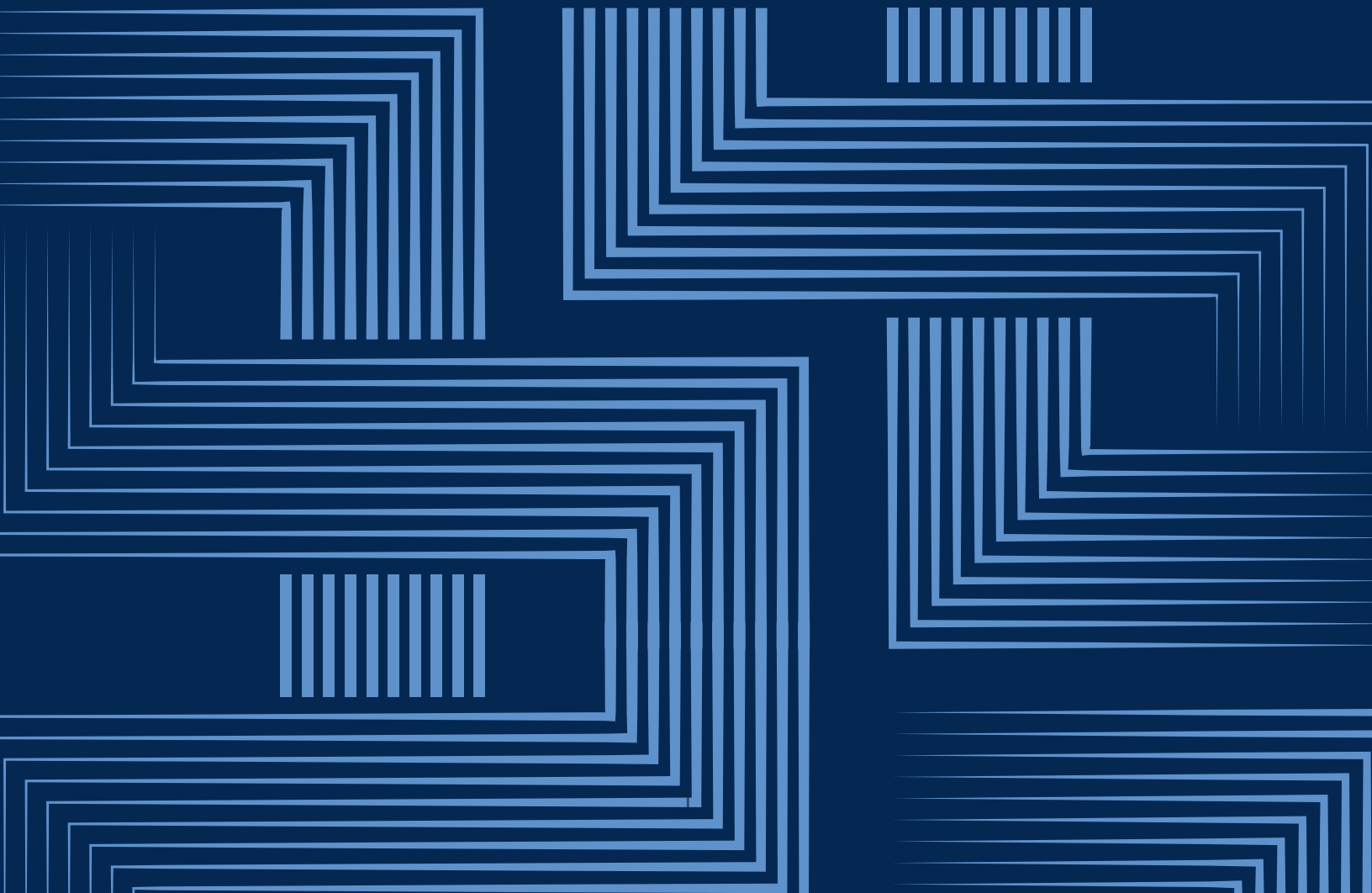

2025 at a Glance

This year Hope For You delivered compassionate service through food access, crisis response, health and outreach partnerships, and international mission engagement throughout 2025. The year reflected a strong global emphasis while sustaining meaningful local and regional support in Greenville and across North Texas.

Local Impact

- Distributed more than 250,000 pounds of food through the Hope For You center during reported 2025 periods, helping families access essential groceries and staples.
- Sustained monthly food distribution, volunteer engagement, and family support in Greenville with support from Brookshire's Farmersville and local faith partners.
- Continued homelessness outreach, anti-tobacco and vaping prevention support, and practical care for vulnerable neighbors.

Regional Impact

- Mobilized food and support across North Texas through convention and church-based distributions, including 70,000 pounds shared at a health and family resources fair.
- Sent truckloads of household products to RCCG churches and expanded collaboration with North Texas Food Bank, civic partners, colleges, and regional health stakeholders.
- Responded to California fires and Texas flooding emergencies with monetary and in-kind support, including PPE, hygiene items, and 240 boxes of wipes.











Global Impact

- Strengthened Hope For You's international footprint through activity and partnership development in Jordan, Nigeria, Malawi, South Korea, and wider global Christian health networks.
- Participated in the Global Missions Health Conference, World Evangelical Alliance General Assembly, and Global Harvest Summit to build health, mission, and humanitarian partnerships.
- Supported Malawi outreach with evangelism, basic health checks, hygiene items, food, clothing, youth engagement, and women's ministry, including 98 reported salvations during village outreach.

Strategic Efforts

- Improved organizational readiness through grant materials, donor prospecting, volunteer recruitment, warehouse upgrades, and expanded grocery sourcing capacity.
- Launched a 12-month workshop cycle focused on personal growth, health and safety, financial wellness, and civic engagement.
- Positioned the organization for continued growth by connecting direct service with long-term partnership development and mission-driven capacity building.

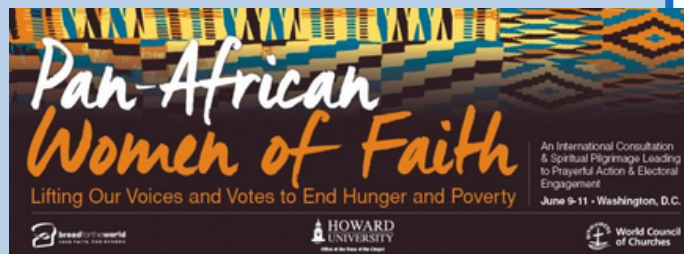
Christian Churches Together

Global Impact - Africa

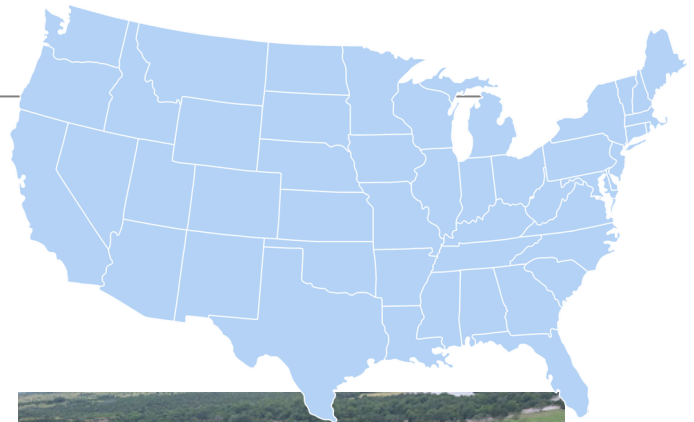
Jordan

National Impact



Response to Texas Flooding

HFY visited the flooded area from July 18 to July 19, 2025, volunteering with local law enforcement, Goodwill, Salvation Army, and Cross Kingdom Church. Upon arrival, Salvation Army officials guided us to Cross Kingdom Church, where our monetary and in-kind donations were warmly appreciated. Contributions included hard hats, gloves, N95 masks, PPE gowns, hygiene products, and five large boxes of wipes.

Expanded Online Counseling Services

HFY expanded its subsidised online counseling service with a new set of certified professionals based in Nigeria. The service allows individuals to schedule sessions to bolster mental health and resiliency.

HFY connected with organizations like the Christian Medical and Dental Organization and groups focusing on medical supplies, disease treatment, and water purification.

Launched Initiatives

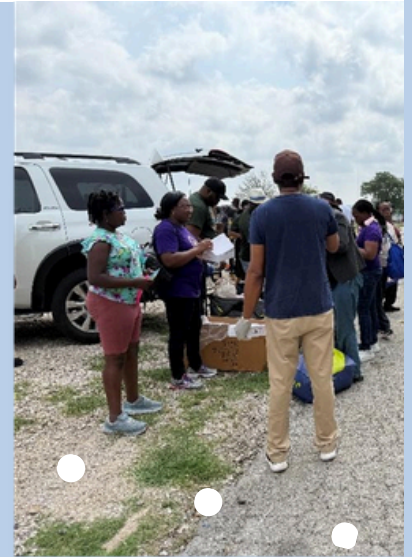

National Event Highlight

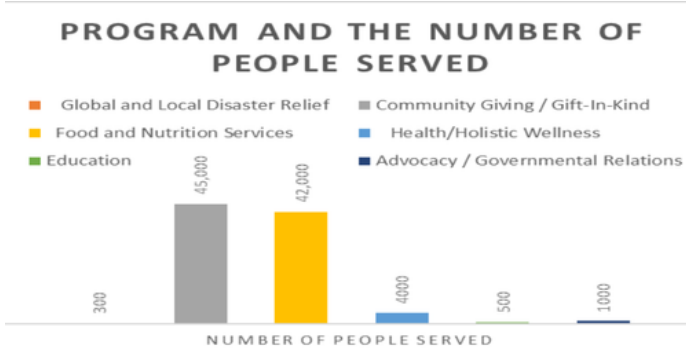
- **School Supplies Distribution:** School backpacks filled with essential school supplies were given to local children.
- **Food & Refreshments:** Attendees enjoyed grilled barbecue meals in a welcoming, community-centered environment.

This year, over 45,000 individuals were served. At the local level, over 1,000,000 pounds of food were donated.

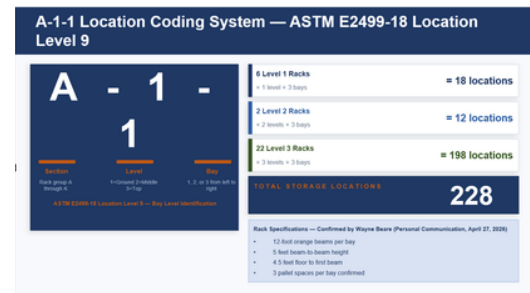


Increasing Efficiency

HFY continues to expand its reach and streamline its food distribution and community engagement operations. Food and water donations are picked up every Tuesday and Thursday through the Brookshire's of Farmersville partnership, supporting the sustainability of our food pantry.

Monthly 3rd Friday major food distribution events were successfully organized, promoted, and distributed to the community through coordinated volunteer teams. Additional operational initiatives include developing alternative food-sourcing channels with other charities and securing approval from the North Texas Food Bank to expand grocery-store sourcing capacity, potentially reducing transportation costs.

There have also been Facility Enhancements & Operational Improvements- Installation of a new pallet rack system to optimize warehouse operations and efficiency.

Headquarters Initiatives Continued

Convention Health and Family Resources Fair

HFY and RCCGNA Children Department hosted a highly successful Community Health Fair, with broad participation and enthusiastic community response.

Notable contributions included: Bella Beauty College, offering free haircuts and shampoo vouchers

Homeless Outreach

Weekly care package deliveries and distribution of anti-tobacco and vaping prevention materials to unhoused individuals in the Greenville area

Youth Engagement

HFY engaged and partnered with youth group from an few organizations and churches in Houston and Dallas for sport ministry.

Blackheart Association

Provided heart screenings, food distributions of about 70,000 pounds, and children’s activities, including games and snow cones.

Support for RCCGNA Kitchen

HFY donated 30,000 prepared silverwares, a pallet of bags of onions and some meat for the participants’ feeding during the convention.

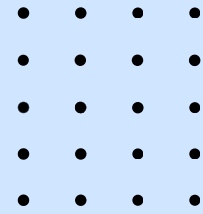
NTFB Partnership

We are aligning our work with NTFB’s five-year strategic plan to increase food access and program integration. Created monthly food distribution flyers and expanded visibility through Greenville Cable Channel 34. Weekly contributions from Brookshire’s Farmersville continue to provide pantry staples—eggs, milk, bread, produce—supporting local food security.

- Build a strong global disaster response team fully equipped.
- Secure new grants for utilities and operational costs.
- Execute Community outreaches with health, food, and financial literacy services. Strengthen income-generating opportunities.
- Identify gaps and opportunities. Understand local and regional poverty, disaster and hunger drivers (conflict, climate, supply chain issues).
- Strengthens Local and global Partnerships — Schools, city agencies, local businesses, JustServe etc.
- Build a reliable, trained local volunteer base and fundraising team.
- Build both local and International Partnerships — NGOs, governments, UN agencies and philanthropic foundations.
